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The directors of Red Architectural Ltd recognise the importance of health, safety, welfare and the environment in the successful operation of its activities.

Red Architectural Ltd acknowledges its obligation under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974. The company's philosophy and practice is to conduct its activities in compliance with the Health and Safety at Work Act, the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations and environmental needs, in particular to ensure that so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and welfare of its employees and those who may be affected by its activities. The directors and employees will dynamically participate to achieve, maintain and improve the elimination or reduction of risk, paying close attention to accident prevention.

The company will, as required, provide and maintain for its employees:-

- b. Safe handling, storage, maintenance, and transport of work articles and substances
- c. Necessary information, instruction, training and supervision
- d. A safe place of work
- e. A safe working environment with adequate welfare facilities

All directors and employees of the company, the company's Sub-Contractors and their employees will be made aware of statutory duties, standards and codes of practice, the requirement to co-operate with and actively support those duties and not to interfere with anything provided in the interests of health, safety, welfare and the environment.

The company seeks to accomplish its legal and civil duty as defined in the enclosed organisation and arrangements. They are planned to relate to the company's activities within the industry.

A safety, health, welfare and environment management system is operational and is in use by all levels of employees.

The responsibilities for the day-to-day operation of the safety management system is conducted through the Managing Director by the Operations Managers, designated Managers and delegated to Site Managers.
